Code Of Conduct

1. All kaihoe must wear a **life-jacket**
2. Kaihoe must paddle in their **own age group** – may not paddle up or down (steerers permitted only!)
3. No aluminium or waka ama shaped **paddles** allowed – kopapa blade shape only
4. **No bandanas/gang affiliated** colours/attire etc...
5. All teams must be in **uniform** – adult steerer may be excused
6. Confident **steerer** for Year 4-6 teams only...may include older paddler or adult, however, are only permitted to rudder steer. Disqualifications will apply to those who pin/draw steer and paddle. Final call will be made Waki.
7. **Division One:-**
 - a. 1st and 2nd place getters from heats progress to Division One
 - b. Overall aggregate trophy awarded to the school who has the most number of teams placed in the Division One finals
 - c. Medals awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place-getters of the finals
8. **Division Two:-**
 - a. 3rd and 4th place getters from heats will progress to Division Two
 - b. Trophies will be awarded for place-getters of the finals
9. Four lanes/waka per heat and progressions (some races may require 5 lanes)
10. **Disqualifications/Allowances/Protests:**
 - a. No crossing lanes
 - b. Full crew without paddle & life-jacket
 - c. Language – inappropriate use and behavior towards each other (warning will be given)
 - d. Misuse of code of conduct
 - e. All protests and queries about races etc...must be presented to Waki by school coordinators
