

## Waka Ama Events Race Safety Briefing Checklist

Your Safety Briefing (at a minimum) should cover the following: Explain the Safety Waiver Expected conditions and local weather patterns Tide times and likely effect Wind direction and likely effect Required safety equipment Race course: o Explain any hazards on the course o Explain exit points if paddlers need to withdraw from the race o Give detailed information about race course – use a physical map to emphasise and explain key points/hazards/turning buoys Safety Checking process Race start time/s and race start procedure Finish line location and finish procedure Safe launching and exiting of the water The number of Safety Boats on the water and how to identify them, explain which boat will be the lead boat etc – Use bright flags to indicate Lead Boat and Support Boats How to raise assistance in an emergency – 'paddle in the air' The course can be changed during the race, explain the procedure At any time the Race Director or Race Official can stop a paddler/s from competing/completing if they show signs that they will not complete the race in an acceptable time or acceptable condition. All paddlers must check out (if they withdraw from race) Encourage good practice e.g. hydration, appropriate clothing and equipment
