Soup will be served throughout the day for paddlers, and food and coffee stalls for all. Hangi is served after race 2 and prize giving and closing karakia after the last race. The Te Whiringa e Rua trophy will not necessarily be handed to the fastest team, but to a person, team or club that upholds the spirit and values of waka ama and the Pearl of the North event.

ACCOMODATION

There are no marae facilities available this year due to advanced bookings, however we have worked with our school to provide tent /some classroom/shower and cooking facilities for those wishing to stay close to the race venue (2km), please bring your own beddings . Cost is \$10 p/p\$

However there are lots of motels and BnB only 10mins away in the Kerikeri/Waipapa area as well as bookabach at Tapuaetahi Beach.

WAKA HIRE

W6 re typically around \$120 for a mahimahi with skirts, bring your own bailers, rope and jackets and any extra lashings, just in case.
