Racing will start at 8am on Saturday 25TH April (ANZAC Day) to allow for three race starts. This will free up the waka to be used among multiple crews.

VENUE TIKANGA

Reusable coffee cups and water bottles are encouraged to assist with low waste, we are asking paddlers to bring your own coffee cup (though there will be cups available) AND water bottle. There will be no sale of water in plastic bottles at the site, we will have drinkable water taps available around the event site. As with all National events this is a no smoking, no vaping, no alcohol and no drug event. Please be mindful of some of the alcohol rules that may be around the marina. If you must inhale we suggest you go off site or onto the main road.

BACK UP RACE DAY

If the weather or sea conditions make it unsafe to paddle any one of the allocated races then Sunday, 26th April 2020 is the back-up race day. Paddlers are advised to make plans to be available that day.



ENTRY FEES

The fees for all entries received prior to 7 April are:

Grade	W6	W1 Rudderless/W1 Rudderred/W2	Combination
Seniors	\$60 each	\$60 each	\$90 each
Juniors	\$40 each	\$40 each	\$60 each

NOTE:

- If a senior paddler is entered in both the W6 and W1 Rudderless/W1 Rudderred races the entry fee payable is \$90.00.
- If a Junior paddler is entered in both the W6 and W1 Rudderless/W1 Rudderred races, the entry fee payable is \$60.00.
- Entry into a third event would cost a further \$30.00 for seniors and \$20.00 for Juniors ie: W6 + W1+W2 = \$120.00/Senior or \$80/Junior.

PENALTIES

Any late additions/changes/withdrawals after the 7th April, a \$20 per paddler late fee will apply e.g. division changes, paddler swap, additions.

Any club that withdraws teams after being invoiced will still be charged the full entry fee.

All team entries are to be entered via the Waka Ama New Zealand website through your Club Coordinator.

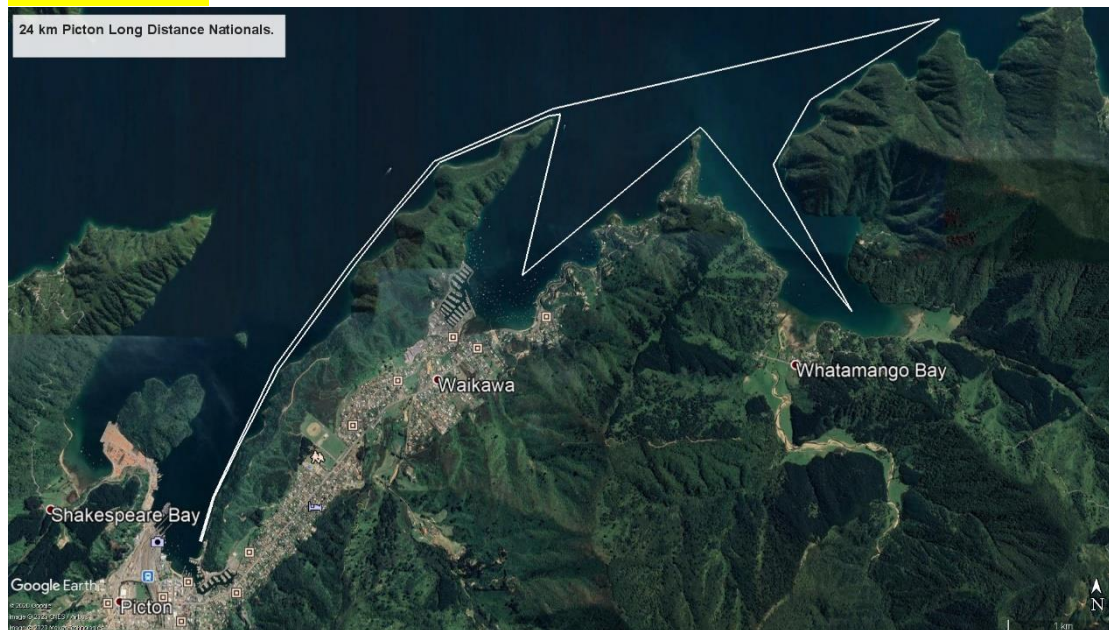

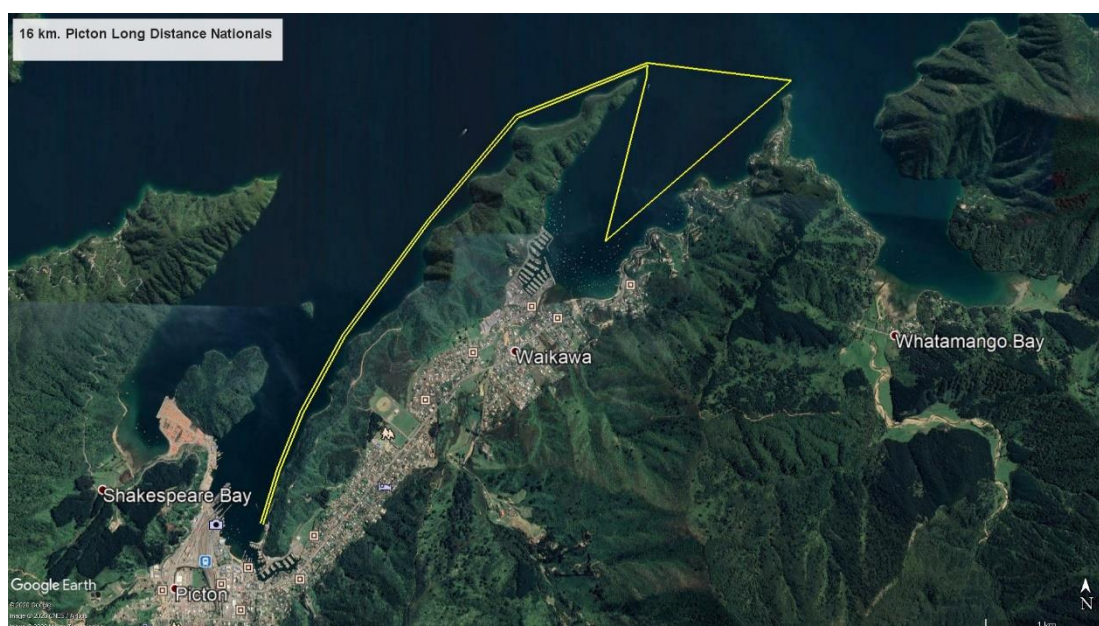

24 KM COURSE

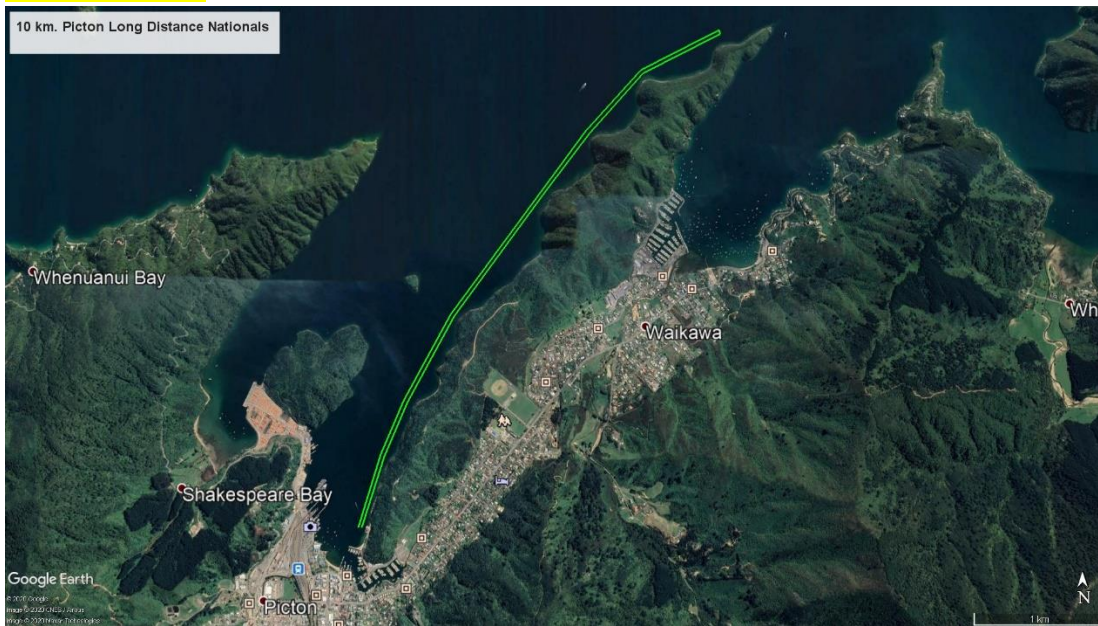


16 KM COURSE

APPENDIX C: Site Map



The site maps shows the location of everything including the boat ramp we will be using to load out waka. All waka will be parked in the green field. Safety checks will occur in the field, where all rigging will take place. This is to reduce congestion at the boat ramp and to aid in the flow of traffic around the marina.

Attached above is a link to the parking. Disability parking will be available closer to the beach, with specified parking for para paddlers. Shelley Beach road will be closed to traffic except for emergency vehicles, QCYC Staff and WakaAmaNZ Admin, specified Para parking.

Please note that there is ample free parking in the green field all other parking is paid parking.

APPENDIX E: Trailer Parking

Note that trailer parking is also in the greenfield and a designated area is set aside for trailers. The trailer parking will be **open on Thursday from 8am till 3.45pm and then from 5pm till late**. On Friday the trailer park will be open from **3.30pm until late**. If you are arriving after 7pm please let us know so we can let security know you will be arriving late. Please email at ldn@wakaama.co.nz.

If you are arriving before Thursday the 23 April also please let us know, we can arrange to have your waka stored down at the site in the greenfield but we need to know in advance. Any storage before the 23rd will not have security, except for a locked gate.
