

Te Waka o Aoraki welcome Secondary Schools from across Canterbury and the West Coast to the 2021 Canterbury-Westland Secondary Schools Sprint Championships to be held at Lake Rua on Saturday 6 March 2021. This is intended to be a fun event that offers something to both those new to waka ama, as well as those with more experience. It also provides a pathway for Secondary Schools that want to participate at the Waka Ama New Zealand Secondary School Nationals to be held at Lake Tikitapu, Rotorua from 23rd – 26th March 2021.

Lake Rua is located in Harewood, Christchurch, 12 mins / 6 kms from Christchurch Airport.

Grades, Events and Divisions

There are two main grades for teams:

- Junior: Year 9-10
- Senior: Year 11-13

There are two main events that will be contested in each age group:

- W6 250m (Single hulled, six person canoe with an outrigger, raced over 250 metres)
- W12 250m (Double hulled, twelve person canoe raced over 250 metres)

Teams can be either all male, all female or mixed. Mixed W6 teams must have at least 2 Female paddlers racing. Mixed W12 crews must have at least 5 females, otherwise the team will race in the Male grade.

There will also be two main divisions:

- Takiwai / Novice (5 students required, with an adult steerer / or a steerer provided)
- Kahuraki / Advanced (6 students required, including their own competent steerer)

Teams will race against teams in other divisions in the preliminary rounds before having finals for each division (depending on the number of entries).

Entries fees are \$25 per team and entries are to be made via Secondary School Sport. Please see your School Sport Coordinator to make your entry.

Trainings and Preparation

This event is aimed to encourage students to give waka ama a go and therefore is set up in such a way that minimum preparation is required on behalf of schools ahead of the event (particularly for teams in the Takiwai / Novice division). These teams will be given support and assistance at the event to ensure they get the most out of the day. For Schools who wish to undertake trainings ahead of the event, they are encouraged to utilise any existing resources within their school and/or relationships with local clubs to prepare teams. Training sessions can also be organised for those that request them, but are dependant on the availability of instructors to assist with these.
