A prizegiving was held after the event, and competitors who had placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd, and had competed in at least 3 of the events of the Hauraki Series, won medals. Each year, all of the medals across the series, have been designed and hand made by paddlers within each of the clubs. This year for the series, Te Aputa Tira Hoe Waka Ama Club was on medal duty. They came up with an awesome design, and the amazing and talented Andrea Hill and her girls made all of the medals. Turangawaewae Waka Sports was the series Overall Club points winner and were presented with the Jessie Te Huia Memorial Hoe
